## *Graduation Certification Information for Foreign Students*

## Eligibility:

Students eligible for graduation from GBA English Track program

Foreign students who had English Language Test Scores by the time they entered the university.
※ Currently, only Global Business Administration and Computer Engineering departments offer admission to foreign students. However, other departments may open admissions in the future.

1. Regarding the above information, we would like to let you know more about the following graduation standards as requested by the International Office for the smooth graduation certification of students in the English Track program.

Graduation certification: If the total number of credits taken in Major subjects and Liberal Arts subjects is more than the credits set by individual departments for graduation, then the certification for graduation shall be approved.

1) Major Courses: Each department has different Major Elective and Major Required course selection requirements in order to graduate. So the students must take all the required major courses depending on his/her entry year.
2) Liberal Arts Courses: Apart from the Major Courses credit requirements for graduation, credits taken from any other departments are collectively recognized as Liberal Arts credits. For more information, please visit the GBA office.

## Reasons for applying for graduation certification

1) Foreign students only use English and are therefore not able to participate in Korean-mediated classes.
2) Among the liberal arts courses, classes that are offered in English in different study areas are not currently open.
3) As the number of students studying in the English Track increases, it becomes more difficult to participate in English-mediated classes.
4) Other Major courses taught in English are also recognized as Liberal Arts courses, but students have difficulties changing them on their own.

## Expected Effects:

1) Facilitating the smooth selection of classes for English Track students and resolving the confusion about graduation certification in advance.
2) Making it easier for course departments and university administration to guide foreign students on the English Track.
